WELCOME BABY SIM ELLIE!

The Elliot recently received a new Baby Simulator to help educate staff about how to care for pediatric patients. The Baby Sim was purchased with the help of the Elliot Young Professionals Group and individual contributions.

Patti Laliberte, Clinical Nurse Educator of Pediatrics says, "We will use the Baby Sim to train the multi-disciplinary staff that care for pediatric patients. Some staff have encountered a Baby Sim during a course called Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) which is an American Heart Association (AHA) course designed to help teams recognize and intervene when a child decompensates and needs immediate and potentially life-saving interventions. We will also use the Baby Sim for simulated events like mock Code Blue PALS or other pediatric emergencies that may arise in our clinical areas. The biggest benefit to this manikin is that it is portable and almost completely wireless so it can be brought to out-of-hospital locations such as ambulatory surgical areas, ambulatory practices, and our EMS Institute. It has the capability to impact many of our healthcare providers which in turn helps us all perform better when a pediatric patient comes into our system for care. The better care we can provide, the better outcome for the child and their family."
